Our Goal

To provide a unique learning environment for high school students that supports post-secondary enrollment and increases their readiness for the college experience.

Our Services

College Tours

To expose our participants to a variety of college campuses, we provide in- and out-of-state college tours.

Counseling & Workshops

We provide individual and group counseling that promote educational goal setting and career awareness. We also offer workshops detailing financial planning for college.

Tutoring

Our tutors provide individual assistance at our target high schools and at Morgan State University. We help our participants prepare for their current classes, high school assessments and college admission tests.

Financial Support

We provide financial support to our participants through stipends and covering the college applications and admission tests fees.

Community Service

We provide community service opportunities to help our participants meet their Service Learning requirement.

Academic Components

Academic Year

The Academic Year Component consist of after school and Saturday tutoring, cultural and recreational activities, college tours, trips, and workshops for our participants and their parents.

Summer Component

Our Summer Component is intensive but a fun, enriching, and beneficial six-week summer program in which students live on Morgan's campus and take college preparatory courses with emphasis on English, Science, Computer Science, Mathematics, and SAT/ACT Test Preparation

Bridge Component

Our Bridge Component awards graduating seniors with an opportunity to take college courses that are transferable to the college where he or she will attend during the fall.
