Morgan State University has one College and seven Schools. Freshmen are encouraged to declare a major before the end of the second semester of enrollment. Baccalaureate degrees are offered in the following fields of study (See latest version of the *Academic Catalog* for the most current list of concentrations and minors.):

College of Liberal Arts: Broadcast and Integrated Media Production ; Economics; English; Fine Art; History; Journalism; Screenwriting and Animation; Music; Philosophy; Political Science; Psychology; Public Relations, Advertising and Media Sales and Ratings; Sociology; Speech Communication; and Theatre Arts.

School of Architecture and Planning: Architecture and Environmental Design.

FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN

Honors Program scholarships are a part of the student's overall financial aid package. Therefore, the actual amount of funding received may vary from the initial amount actually awarded.

First-Time Freshman Scholarships are automatically renewed and available for up to eight (8) semesters when the recipient maintains satisfactory academic progress.

The candidate should have been admitted to Morgan by the May 1 "priority scholarship consideration date" in order to qualify for an academic scholarship.

Gateway Scholarship: minimum high school G.P.A. of 3.00 and total (reading + math) SAT I score 1000 (1100 for non-MD residents) or ACT composite score 22 (24 for non-MD residents). Award provides up to \$2,500 per semester toward tuition & fees and on-campus room & board costs.

Special Condition: *If the student accepts or provides non-Honors Program funding totaling at least the cost of semester tuition & fees, the Gateway Scholarship will be increased to an amount that covers the unmet semester on-campus room & board costs up to \$3,750 per semester, pending available funds.*

Chair's Scholarship: minimum high school G.P.A. of 3.20 and total (reading + math) SAT I score 1100 (1200 for non-MD residents) or ACT composite score 24 (27 for non-MD residents). Award provides up to \$5,000 per semester toward tuition & fees and on-campus room & board costs. A \$250 per semester book allowance is also included with this award.

Dean's Scholarship: minimum high school G.P.A. of 3.40 and total (reading + math) SAT I score 1200 (1300 for non-MD residents) or ACT composite score 27 (29 for non-MD residents). Award provides up to \$7,500 per semester toward tuition & fees and on-campus room & board costs. A \$500 per semester book allowance is also included with this award.

Regents' Scholarship: minimum high school G.P.A. of 3.60 and total (reading + math) SAT I score 1300 (1400 for non-MD residents) or ACT composite score of 29 (32 for non-MD residents). Award pays up to the full amount of semester tuition & fees and on-campus room & board costs, in addition to a \$1000 per semester book allowance. Recipients also receive a laptop/notebook computer.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

The candidate should have been admitted to Morgan by the May 1 "priority scholarship consideration date" in order to qualify for an academic scholarship.

Bridge Grant: minimum college G.P.A. of 2.50 (3.0 for non-MD residents) and a total of 24 credits. Award provides up to \$1,000 per semester (\$2,000 per semester for non-MD residents) toward educational expenses.

The candidate should have been admitted to Morgan by the April 1 "priority scholarship consideration date" in order to qualify for an academic scholarship. The candidate must apply directly from a MARYLAND community college and have at least 50% of her or his earned credits from a community college.

Tuition Scholarship: minimum community college G.P.A. of 3.00 and **either** a total of 56 credits **or** an A.A. or A.S. degree. Award provides the full amount of the semester tuition and fees.

Honors Scholarship: minimum community college G.P.A. of 3.50 **and** an A.A. or A.S. degree. Award provides up to the full cost of semester tuition & fees and on-campus room & board costs and an additional \$750 per semester book allowance.

*If the candidate holds an Associate's Degree from a Maryland Community College, she or he might not be required to pursue any additional General Education courses. Please consult the MSU Transfer Center for more details.

Transfer Scholarships are automatically renewed and available for up to five (5) semesters when the recipient maintains satisfactory academic progress.

Important Dates

November 15: Priority Consideration Deadline. Applications submitted by this date will receive admission and scholarship decisions by February

February 15: Applications submitted by this date will receive admission and scholarship decisions by April 15th.

March 1: Deadline to file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Housing application, Residence Hall Agreement, and pre-payment fee due for students seeking on-campus housing for the fall semester.

April 15: Final date to apply for Fall admission.

May 15: Enrollment confirmation deadline for Honors scholarship recipients. Confirmation is noted by payment of the \$150 non-refundable confirmation fee.

June 15: Enrollment confirmation deadline for ALL new freshmen and transfer students. Confirmation is noted by payment of the \$150 non-refundable confirmation fee.
