*BIOL 102 is a pre-requisite for BIOL 201 and BIOL 202. It is not a Nursing pre-requisite: therefore, students transferring into Morgan State University that have already taken BIOL 201, 202 & 405 are not required to take BIOL 102.

**As of the Fall 2011 semester NUSC 367 is the required Nutrition course for Nursing students.

Students **must** either be currently enrolled in or have completed all Pre-professional Nursing Requirements when applying to the program. It is strongly recommended by the faculty/staff for applicants to complete all General Education Requirements, due to the vigorous nature of the Nursing program.

Application to the Nursing Program takes place the semester prior to the student's anticipated enrollment in the first nursing course.
