



OVERVIEW

Morgan's Master of Professional Accountancy degree program (MPA) is designed for students seeking to meet the requirements for the Maryland Certified Public Accountants' (CPA) Examination. Students holding an undergraduate degree in accounting may use this program to meet the 150 hour requirement for the CPA exam. Students holding an undergraduate degree in a business area may use this program to meet the accounting course requirements for the CPA exam. Non business students interested in the CPA exam are also welcome to apply to the program. However, these students must take business core courses before taking accounting courses..

All courses are offered in the evenings and on weekends to accommodate working students.

A track in forensic accounting will be available in fall 2013. This track is designed to help students qualify for the Certified Fraud Examination (CFE) and become practicing forensic accountants.

ADMISSIONS

- Applicants are required to have a bachelor's degree from an accredited university, an overall GPA of 3.0 or better.
- Official GMAT scores (no more than 5 years old)
- Three letters of recommendation
- Personal Statement
- The program requires 30 credit hours and is designed to be completed in 3 semesters. Program participants are expected to be fulltime students and to complete courses as a cohort.
