Please include both numbers in any written communication you may send to the School of Graduate Studies. I have included a list of personnel in the Office of the Dean who are available to assist you. **The School of Graduate Studies has negotiated several options for the printing and binding of dissertations and theses. One copy must be purchased through the Bursar at the time the student pays the copyright and publishing fees, and this copy is retained by Morgan in the library. If the student wishes to purchase more for personal library or gifts, up to four more (for a total of five) can be purchased at that time through The HF Group. The other option is to use the author's discount offered when completing the copyright agreement with UMI/ProQuest. The options offered by UMI/ProQuest include different sizes and bindings (hard cover and soft cover; 8.5 by 11 and 6 by 9 inches) and are priced according to the order. The UMI order can be for as many copies as you wish to purchase. You may also do a combination, for instance, ordering a second bound copy through The HF Group and several smaller format, soft-cover copies through UMI/ProQuest.

NOTE: Fees related to dissertations and theses are dependent on the charges of the independent contractors who provide the copyrighting, microfilming, and printing/binding services. Students are required to have their dissertations or theses copyrighted and microfilmed and to provide a minimum of one bound copy for inclusion in the Soper Library collection. There may be additional fees depending upon the student's program. All costs, tuition, and fees listed above represent charges in effect at the time of publication of this Course Scheduling Guide and may change prior to the start of the semester or prior to publication of a new Course Scheduling Guide.

FINANCIAL AID

The School of Graduate Studies offers several forms of financial support to qualified graduate students including Assistantships, Fellowships, Scholarships, and Tuition Awards. To be considered for financial support, a completed "Application for Assistantship, Fellowship, Scholarship" form must be on file in the School of Graduate Studies. For additional information about eligibility criteria, you should consult the *2009-2012 Graduate Catalog*. You may also inquire about opportunities for financial support through the University's Office of Financial Aid, the Office of Residential Life, and the National Transportation Center.

Award recipients should proceed to register via the Internet and their awards will be posted to their individual accounts. Assistantships, fellowships, and/or tuition awards pay for tuition only. University fees must be paid from the personal funds of each award recipient. Failure to pay fees in a timely manner will result in a student's schedule of courses for the semester being deleted by the Bursar.

BILLINGS AND PAYMENTS

After selecting classes, students must print the bill using WebSiS on Morgan State University's website. Instructions for using WebSiS are published in this Scheduling Guide. Registration is not considered complete, nor is a student enrolled, until payment in full or other satisfactory financial arrangements are made. If selection of classes is performed during the late registration period, payment is due immediately. Any outstanding balance (amount not covered by verified loans, grants or scholarships) is due prior to registration being finalized, and an official schedule of courses is issued. Failure to make satisfactory financial arrangements for the balance due by the prescribed date will necessitate cancellation of the class schedule.

The balance due can be paid by one of the following preferred means: cash (in person only), certified check, cashier's check, money orders, VISA, MASTER CARD, DISCOVER CARD, and AMERICAN EXPRESS. Personal checks are acceptable, but if returned for non-sufficient funds (NSF), the check amount will be charged back to the student's account with a \$25.00 added penalty. A student's personal check may not be accepted after the University receives one "non-sufficient funds" check from that student. Payments by mail should be sent to:

All checks and money orders should indicate the student's name, address and account number. Arrangements for deferred payment of tuition and fees are made through the Bursar's Office.

DROPPING CLASSES AND BILLING ADJUSTMENTS

Students dropping course(s) after the close of the official drop/add period are entitled to a prorated adjustment for tuition according to the billing adjustment schedule listed below. Fees are not refundable. The official first day of class is the "instruction begin date" used for determining billing adjustments.

7. Tab to **PIN** box and type in your PIN Number

11. Click **Registration Menu**
12. Placing the cursor on the down arrow under term available, click on **Semester**
13. Click **Select Term**

20. Following Submit Registration, click **Account Summary** to view or print a copy of your bill. Your registration is not complete until your bill is paid. Students receiving fellowships, assistantships, and/or tuition awards must still pay for course fees, undergraduate courses, or classes that they audit.
21. Click **Administrative Functions Menu** to view or change personal information (e.g., PIN number, address, telephone, etc.)
22. Click **Return to Menu** to Exit Morgan State WEBSIS

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. Do I have to go to the office of the School of Graduate Studies in order to register for classes?

No. During the regular registration periods you must register for courses via the Morgan State University website at <http://www.morgan.edu>. Once you locate the website on any computer, simply click on WebSIS and follow the prompts. Detailed registration instructions are contained in this publication.

Every student who wishes to register needs a Personal Identification Number (PIN) in order to access the system. If you do not know your PIN, you must go to the office of the School of Graduate Studies in order to secure one. You cannot secure a PIN Number over the telephone.

Once the registration periods are closed, however, you may not register through WebSIS. Late registration requires the written approval of the Dean of the School of Graduate Studies.

2. Can Morgan State University seniors enroll in classes in the School of Graduate Studies?

Yes, if they meet criteria outlined in the policy concerning Graduate Work by Morgan Seniors found in the 2009 –2010 Graduate Catalog.

3. Are graduate students permitted to register for any undergraduate courses?

Yes. However, those courses cannot be used to satisfy graduate degree requirements nor are they included in the determination of the cumulative grade point average. Tuition for undergraduate courses is not included in the tuition awards funded by the School of Graduate Studies.

4. Can someone take classes in the School of Graduate Studies without having been admitted to a degree program?

Yes, if the person is officially admitted to the School of Graduate Studies as a non-degree student. Official transcripts of all colleges and universities attended must be submitted along with a completed

application to the School of Graduate Studies prior to the registration period.

5. Can I enroll in a class on an audit basis?

Yes. Students admitted to the School of Graduate Studies may audit courses provided permission is obtained from the Dean of the School of Graduate Studies and the course instructor. The Registrar conducts registration for courses to be audited. The auditing fee must be paid at registration and is not included as part of tuition awards. Audited courses may not be used to meet graduation requirements.

6. I have completed all of my courses for my degree and I am writing my thesis or dissertation. Do I have to register?

Yes. All graduate students must maintain continuous enrollment until all degree requirements (courses and thesis/dissertation) are completed. Students should register for either Thesis Seminar ___799 or Dissertation Seminar ___998 (only once); thereafter students register for Thesis Guidance ___797 or Dissertation Guidance ___997 each semester until the thesis or dissertation is complete.

7. Is there any opportunity to defer the payment of part of my registration cost?

Yes. For details, please contact the Bursar's Office.

8. What will happen if my registration costs are not paid in full during the period of registration?

Absent any official financial arrangements, your schedule of classes will be deleted. Registration in the University is not complete until all financial obligations have been satisfied.

9. Will my financial aid (assistantship, fellowship, grant, scholarship) award from the School of Graduate Studies pay all of my registration costs?

No. Financial aid awarded through the office of the School of Graduate Studies pays the cost of tuition only. The award recipient must pay all university

fees. Consult your award letter and the financial aid section of this publication for clarification.

10. When do I need to contact the office of the School of Graduate Studies during the registration period?

You should contact the School of Graduate Studies if you need a PIN number or information about your financial aid award. If you encounter problems in using the Internet to register, contact the HELP desk at 443-885-4357. All other questions should be referred to the representatives of the offices of the Bursar, Registrar, and your academic program.

11. After I have registered, can I withdraw from the University simply by dropping all of my classes?

No. Official withdrawal from the University is a formal procedure that includes notification to the

Dean of the School of Graduate Studies. Simply dropping classes does not constitute official withdrawal from the School of Graduate Studies or the University and may trigger problems relative to financial obligations and grades.

You are encouraged to consult the 2009–2010 School of Graduate Studies catalog for additional information.

12. If I drop my classes, will I still receive a bill?

Yes, depending on the date that you drop your courses you may be responsible for pro-rata payments up to 80% of tuition and fees through the first five weeks of class. After five weeks, you will be responsible for 100% of the total bill. Review the policy on Billing Adjustment above and which is also found in the 2009-2010 Graduate Catalog.

SELECTED ACADEMIC POLICIES

The following academic policies are included to assist you in planning your schedule of courses and in maintaining good academic standing in the School of Graduate Studies. These academic policies do not exhaust the list of Morgan State University policies or the School of Graduate Studies policies that may affect your academic standing or that may apply to your rights and responsibilities as a graduate student. For a more thorough review of academic policies as well as school/college/departmental, and financial aid policies, you are encouraged to consult the 2009–2010 Graduate Catalog.

STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS (5 AND 7 YEARS RULES)

Students, whether part-time or full-time, pursuing graduate degrees at the University with requirements of less than 45 credits, (e.g. most Master's programs), must satisfy all degree requirements within five (5) years from the date of admission to the School of Graduate Studies.

Students, whether part-time or full-time, pursuing graduate degrees at the University with requirements greater than 45 credits, (e.g. Doctoral programs), must satisfy all degree requirements within seven (7) years from the date of admission to the School of Graduate Studies.

Failure to satisfy all degree requirements within the relevant statute of limitations is evidence of failure to make satisfactory academic progress and is, therefore, grounds for dismissal from the School of

Graduate Studies. Students whose statute of limitations has expired and who have been dismissed from the School of Graduate Studies will not be permitted to re-enroll in the degree program.

COURSE LOADS

Students enrolled for 9 or more graduate credit hours are considered full-time. The maximum course load for full-time students in the Spring and Fall semesters is 15 credit hours. Students enrolled for less than nine (9) credits and for a minimum of six (6) credits are considered part-time. The School of Graduate Studies conducts two Summer sessions; the maximum course load for graduate students during each of the two Summer sessions is seven (7) credits.

GRADING POLICIES

A minimum grade point average of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) for all graduate level courses taken since enrollment in the degree program is required for good academic standing and for graduation. Graduate programs may stipulate academic requirements more stringent than the minimum standards established by the School of Graduate Studies. Grades of "C" may not count for more than 20 percent of total credit hours required to satisfy degree requirements. Grades of "D" are not awarded and "F" grades do not receive graduate credit but do count in determining a student's cumulative grade point average (G.P.A.).

All graduate students are subject to the academic regulations of both the School of Graduate Studies and the school or department in which they are enrolled. For example, students enrolled in the doctoral program in History must maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.5. Although a student may be required to enroll in an undergraduate course as a prerequisite to a graduate course (or admittance to a graduate program), undergraduate courses will not count for graduate credit.

DROPPING COURSES/WITHDRAWAL FROM SCHOOL

Students wishing to make adjustments to their course schedules must do so within the drop-add period indicated on the academic calendar for the School of Graduate Studies. Students who are not successful in dropping or adding courses via the WEB must appear in person at the Office of the School of Graduate Studies to file the necessary forms. DROP/ADD forms must have the course instructor's signature.

Stopping payment on checks for registration fees and/or failing to attend class does not constitute an official drop of a course nor do stop payments or absence from class constitute withdrawal from school. Failure to officially drop a course will result in a grade of "F" being assigned for the course. Failure to officially drop a course or failure to officially withdraw from school does not relieve graduate students of their financial obligation to the University.

Students must notify the Dean of School of Graduate Studies in writing and complete and sign the necessary withdrawal form(s) to officially withdraw from the University. Depending upon the time

during the semester that their course is dropped or they officially withdraw from the University, students will be subject to a pro rata amount of the tuition and fees for the semester.

ACADEMIC PROBATION/DISMISSAL

A student is automatically on academic probation at the end of any semester when his/her cumulative grade point average falls below 3.0. As a courtesy, the Dean of the School of Graduate Studies (or the Dean's designee) typically notifies students in writing of their probationary status. Students who are on academic probation are not eligible to receive tuition awards, fellowships, assistantships and/or other scholarships from the School of Graduate Studies. Students will be dismissed when they accumulate two (2) consecutive semesters with a cumulative grade point average less than that required for good academic standing in their respective program of study.

APPLICATION FOR GRADUATION

Students must file an Application for Graduation with the Dean of the School of Graduate Studies by November 1 if they expect to complete all requirements for graduation by the May commencement ceremonies (i.e., by the end of the Fall semester of any year). Students who file an Application for Graduation by November 1 and who successfully complete all graduation requirements will receive their diploma during May commencement ceremonies. All graduates, including those who complete in December of the preceding year as well as those who complete in May, are expected to participate in the commencement ceremonies.

Students must file an Application for Graduation with the Dean of the School of Graduate Studies by May 31 if they expect to complete all requirements for graduation after the May commencement ceremonies but by the end of the Fall semester (i.e., December of any year). Students who file an Application for December graduation and who successfully complete all graduation requirements will receive their diploma but are expected to participate in the commencement ceremonies held the following May.

Before the Application for Graduation is filed with the Dean of the School of Graduate Studies, it must be signed by the Department Chairperson and stamped by the Bursar after the application fee has

been paid. If a student does not complete all requirements for graduation by the end of the semester indicated on the Application for Graduation, a new form must be completed for the year (and semester) in which the degree is to be awarded. Although a new Application for Graduation must be filed whenever a student does not finish in the semester indicated on the application, the application fee is paid only once. Students applying for graduation should also make arrangements with the University Bookstore for the rental of academic robes and regalia.

SUBMITTING DISSERTATIONS AND THESES

In general, students may register for the thesis or dissertation seminar when they: 1) have met the residency requirement for their program, 2) are in good academic standing, and 3) have their department's approval.

Degree candidates who have prepared a thesis or dissertation as a partial fulfillment of the requirements for the masters or doctoral degree are required to submit the final, approved manuscript in an electronic format as prescribed by the School of Graduate Studies. In a formal submission interview, the manuscript is submitted to the Dean of the School of Graduate Studies for review following the candidate's oral defense. The thesis or dissertation must be signed by the Committee members and meet all other requirements prior to its submission. The candidate must provide an original, signed copy of the signature page at the time of submission.

Procedures and regulations governing the formatting, production, and submission are

published in the Morgan State University School of Graduate Studies *Dissertation and Thesis Handbook, 2009* (currently available on the School of Graduate Studies Web Site). The *Handbook* reports the most current requirements and submission procedures and is updated regularly. Graduate students submitting a thesis or dissertation to the School of Graduate Studies will be charged a fee for publishing and copyrighting their work, and pay for one print and bound copy for the Morgan State University Library. The School of Graduate Studies publishes the most current information on tuition and fees—including the current publishing fee and copyright fee—and the cost for a UMI-prepared library copy in the *Course Scheduling Guide* each Fall and Spring term. All fees are subject to change, and the candidate is responsible for paying fees in force at the time of submission. Fees are paid to the Bursar. Payment of the fees must be verified by a receipt from the cashier's office and the cashier's receipt must be presented at the time of formal thesis or dissertation submission. Additional copies for personal or for departmental library can be purchased through UMI Publishing.

NOTE:

The Dean or the Dean's designee will provide a list of necessary corrections, if any, to the student, the student's committee chairperson, and to the dean of the college or school in which the student's degree program is located. All corrections to the dissertation or thesis must be satisfactorily completed and accepted by the School of Graduate Studies before a student is eligible to participate in graduation ceremonies.
