Technology and/or Course Components Section

Forage Simulation

You will complete a virtual Forage simulation to explore your interest in different working styles and scenarios. Students will be asked to respond to a reflection prompt in Canvas OR participate in a live discussion activity related to the session.

The examples below make it easy for you to embed the Career Explorer simulation in your syllabus. Depending on how much time commitment you'd like your students to have, you may use the simulation on its own or alongside related topics you might be teaching already.
