The MAT Program, through the Maryland State Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped, provides students with print reading disabilities, attending a 2-4 year public or private Maryland colleges, required course textbooks * at no charge to the student!**

Textbooks are provided in several formats to accommodate the technological and reading needs of the student. Common formats are:

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Students attending any Maryland 2-4 year public or private college with verifiable print disabilities are eligible for MAT services. To qualify, students must provide a statement and confirmation from one of the following:

- A doctor indicating disability
- A Division of Rehabilitation Services counselor
- Their college's Disability Support Services office or school official
- Letter from social worker, rehabilitation professional, librarian, or other qualified professional.
- Proof of patron membership to the Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped.
