Turning age 65? Medicare and your Employee Health Benefits

Understanding the impact of Medicare on your State of Maryland health benefits

Important things to know as you remain employed past your 65th Birthday:

- As an active State employee who is receiving health insurance benefits (medical and prescription coverage), you can delay the enrollment into Medicare Part B and Part D, without penalty, until you decide to retire OR separate from State service.
 Employee health insurance remains the primary coverage.
- Any eligible dependents covered under your active State employee coverage can also delay Medicare Part B and Part D enrollment, without penalty, until you retire OR separate from State service OR you choose to drop the dependent from your coverage.
- o If you plan to retire **during** your 65th year, contact Medicare at I-800-Medicare to discuss Medicare enrollment options (Part A & B). Information is also available at both CMS.gov and Medicare.gov.
- Part D enrollment options can be discussed with Via Benefits, the State of Maryland's Part D resource for State of Maryland retirees and their dependents. Contact Via Benefits at 1-855-556-4419 or visit my.viabenefits.com/Maryland.
- Individuals with End Stage Renal Disease (ESRD) may have different Medicare eligibility requirements. Please contact Medicare at 1-800-Medicare to discuss ESRD and Medicare eligibility.

Once you decide to retire (or separate from State service) past age 65:

- Contact Medicare (Part A & B) and Via Benefits (Part D) to inform them of your and/or your dependent's need to enroll in Medicare. State Retirees must be enrolled in Medicare Parts A, B & D to ensure full claims coverage.
- Employee Benefits Division (EBD) recommends contacting Medicare 3 months in advance of your retirement date to ensure there is time to arrange Medicare enrollment to coincide with day one of your retirement. If you will have a disability retirement, special Medicare eligibility rules may apply. See Medicare and Your State Benefits in Guide to your Health Benefits 2025. Guide to your Health Benefits 2025
