JOB SUMMARY

Under direct supervision, cleans carpets, strips, waxes and maintains all hard floor surfaces, and performs other custodial duties as required. Proficient in operating various floor equipment (i.e. scrubbers, burnishers, carpet extractor and chariots, etc.). Takes appropriate and necessary precautions to ensure the safety of students, faculty, staff and visitors and other associates in accordance with established protocol. Tasked with

PRIMARY DUTIES

- 1. Maintains all designated floor areas assigned by supervisor at a level 1 standard of cleanliness and sanitation.
- 2. Removes spots from carpets, performs bonnet and extraction carpet cleaning.
- 3. Operates floor buffers, scrubbers, strippers, vacuum cleaning equipment and shop vacuums.
- 4. Cleans, dust mops, strips, and waxes floors.
- 5. Measures chemicals correctly based on industry standards.
- 6. Cleans, maintains, and stores equipment and PPE proficiently.
- 7. Cleans up behind all projects (i.e. baseboards, base of doors, etc.).
- 8. Maintains record of weekly, monthly, yearly floor care and schedule cleaning duties.
- 9. Reports maintenance issues to the supervisor.
- 10. Performs other duties as assigned.
